Leonardo Drew creates reflective abstract sculptural works that play upon the dystopic tension between order and chaos. His works have been shown nationally and internationally and are in numerous museum collections, including the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York; The Guggenheim Museum; The Museum of Contemporary Art, Los Angeles; The Hirshhorn Museum and Sculpture Garden, Washington, D.C.; and the Tate Modern in London.

The Betty Jean and Wayne Thiebaud Endowed Lecture honors the Thiebauds' long commitment to educating the eye and hand along with the mind. The endowment, started in 2015, complements the Art Studio Program's Visiting Artist Lecture Series, a core component of the Art Studio MFA Program, increasing its ability to invite distinguished artists, critics and curators to UC Davis.
